Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time

All of us want to be happy and whether we admit it or not we keep trying out various paths which we hope will lead us to the happiness we seek. Is there a sure fix recipe for happiness? Or should I rely on God alone the source of true happiness? Jesus by his life showed us the way to happiness and challenged us to acquire his attitudes to be truly happy. The first reading from the prophet Jeremiah contains a 'curse' and a 'blessing' from the prophet. Jeremiah, Yahweh's mouthpiece says, 'A curse on the one who puts one's trust in Man,' and 'A blessing on the one who puts his trust in the Lord.' The choice is ours: God or man!

Today's gospel Jesus says we have to make a choice: we have to choose God or man, riches or poverty. Jesus blesses the poor and delivers a warning to the rich. The rich tend to be content with their present comfortable existence and in their self-sufficiency and tend to forget who their master is. We believe that we can manage without Him. The Kingdom of God is for those who depend on God, for those who are truly poor and worthy of the blessings of the beatitudes. Today we are challenged not to get sucked in the rat race for material possessions, power and position but to trust in God more and more in our lives. St. Augustine wrote: "Trust the past to God's mercy, the present to God's love, and the future to God's providence."



God's Plan in the Old Testament

In the previous essay, we saw that original sin destroyed the harmony between all of mankind and God (Genesis 3: 16-21). However, God, who is loving and merciful, would not abandon the human race (Genesis 3:15). The Old Testament is important because it recounts how God began to work in human history to prepare fallen humankind for reconciliation with Himself (that takes place in the New Testament).



God chose Abraham to be the father of His chosen people, with whom he would reconcile scattered, fallen humanity to himself. He promised to Abraham that "through your offspring, all nations of the earth will be blessed" (Genesis 22: 18; Genesis 12: 2-3). This promise of blessing was also given to Abraham's descendants, Isaac (Genesis 26: 2-4) and Jacob (Genesis 28: 13-14), and carried on in the twelve tribes of Israel (Genesis 32: 29). However, God had not yet made clear the full implication of the blessings that Abraham's

descendants were to bring to all the nations.

Through prophecy, God revealed to Israel the blessings He intended for them:

- · rescue from sin.
- reconciliation with God.
- and bringing God's salvation to all of mankind.

For example, through the prophet Isaiah God foretold that His suffering servant would bear, "the punishment that makes us whole, by his wounds we were healed. We had all gone astray like sheep, all following our own way; But the LORD laid upon him the guilt of us all.... My servant, the just one, shall justify the many, their iniquity he shall bear.... Because he

surrendered himself to death." (Isaiah 53: 3-12). The prophets proclaim the redemption of the people of God and all the nations through the obedience of a suffering servant.

In sum, the fall of our first parents destroyed mankind's friendship with the Creator. In the Old Testament, God formed a particular group of people, Israel, and communicated to them through prophecy God's plan of reconciliation and offer of salvation. The prophecies to Israel in the Old Testament culminate in God's own son Jesus Christ.

In the next essay, we will consider the fulfillment of God's plan for reconciliation in the New Testament.




