


Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

First Sunday of Lent

The world, the flesh and the devil. The lust of the flesh, the lust of the eye and the pride of life... Scripture gives three fold patterns for temptations and challenges in the spiritual life. Today Jesus gives us threefold solutions to defeat the power of darkness. For the attack on the flesh, He teaches us self-denial. By fasting for 40 days, He sanctifies and empowers the prayer He offers to the Father. Despite being given an opportunity to show His power by razzle-dazzle, He shows it in simplicity – an outright rejection of self-aggrandizement; and finally, despite being shown all the kingdom of the world, Jesus doesn't permit His eyes to deviate from its gaze, fixed on the Father. Let's equip ourselves with the surest weapon against evil - prayer and fasting - for whoever has suffered in the flesh has finishes with sin (I Peter 4:1). Let's resist the devil and be assisted by angels.



Two five-week courses are being offered through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community for Faith Formation (VLCFF). These courses are hybrid models. They are composed of both weekly live twohour zoom lectures as well as a rich variety of online course materials and discussion experiences through the University of Dayton's Virtual Learning Community For Faith Formation (VLCFF). The courses are being underwritten by the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston's Office of Evangelization & Catechesis, which pays 100% of the tuition and the cost of any books associated with the courses. This course is part of the course sequence for the catechetical certification:


Introduction to Prayer

"Prayer is our means of taking a sighting, of re-orienting ourselves – by re-establishing contact with our goal. In the presence of God many components of our life fall into perspective and our journey makes more sense. Prayer is inseparable from living" (Casey, p.5). This course explores prayer as essential to our lives as Christian people, as individuals and within our community of faith. Through this course, students will explore the qualities, forms and expressions of prayer that help to form and sustain our lives as Catholic Christians.

Successful completion of this course earns 2.5 CEU's. This course is part of the VLCFF Certificate for Certification sequence, meets on Zoom on Wednesday evenings at 7 pm. Introduction to Paul and Paul's Letters The course is an in-depth look at Paul, including his autobiography according to his letters, then moving on to discuss the authentic letters of Paul as both history and

theology. We will cover topics such as Paul and Politics, Paul and Women, Paul and the Second Coming, Paul and Slavery, Paul and Judaism, and Paul on Salvation and Suffering throughout the five weeks of this course. Students will read a variety of materials including some of the most important articles written about Paul in the twentieth and twenty-first centuries. At the completion of this course students will be able to situate Paul in his first-century environment and talk intelligently about how Paul's theology is relevant for today's church. Successful completion of this course earns 2.5 CEU's, meets

on Zoom on Tuesday evenings at 7 pm.
