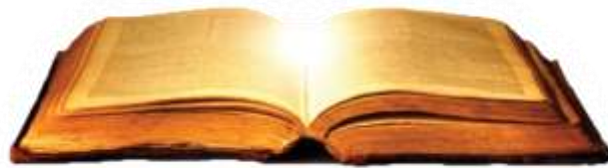
Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

Eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time

A famous quote with a little controversy over its originator says, "watch your thoughts, they become words. Watch your words; they become your actions. Watch your actions for they become your habits. Watch your habits for they become your character. And watch your character for they become your destiny".

In the First Reading today reminds us that as the fruit of a tree shows the care it has had, so does one's speech disclose what is on the person's mind and the passage goes on to instruct that it is wrong to praise someone before he (she) speaks. Sometimes, we have the false feeling that we are better than others and we do not need any form of growth and improvement. It is on account of this faulty thinking that our Lord in the Gospel today maintains that we notice the splinter in our brother's eye but do not perceive the wooden beam in our eyes. This happens when we are quick to blame, criticize, judge and deride other people while making ourselves "saints" and unimpeachable. And when we do not see our own defects, change will not happen. Change begins with self. Jesus did not mean that we cannot criticize each other. The combination of self-criticism and fraternal correction is a perfect recipe for becoming a good person. Instead of wasting time pointing out the mistakes and misdeeds of other people, let us try to focus on our lives; especially on our thoughts to remove those evil thoughts, that produce offensive words, actions, habits, and characters in our lives.

The Pastoral Concerns Committee of the Diocesan Pastoral Council would like to thank you for your participation with our Pastoral Concerns Survey this past fall. We appreciate your input and sharing your thoughts and concerns with us.

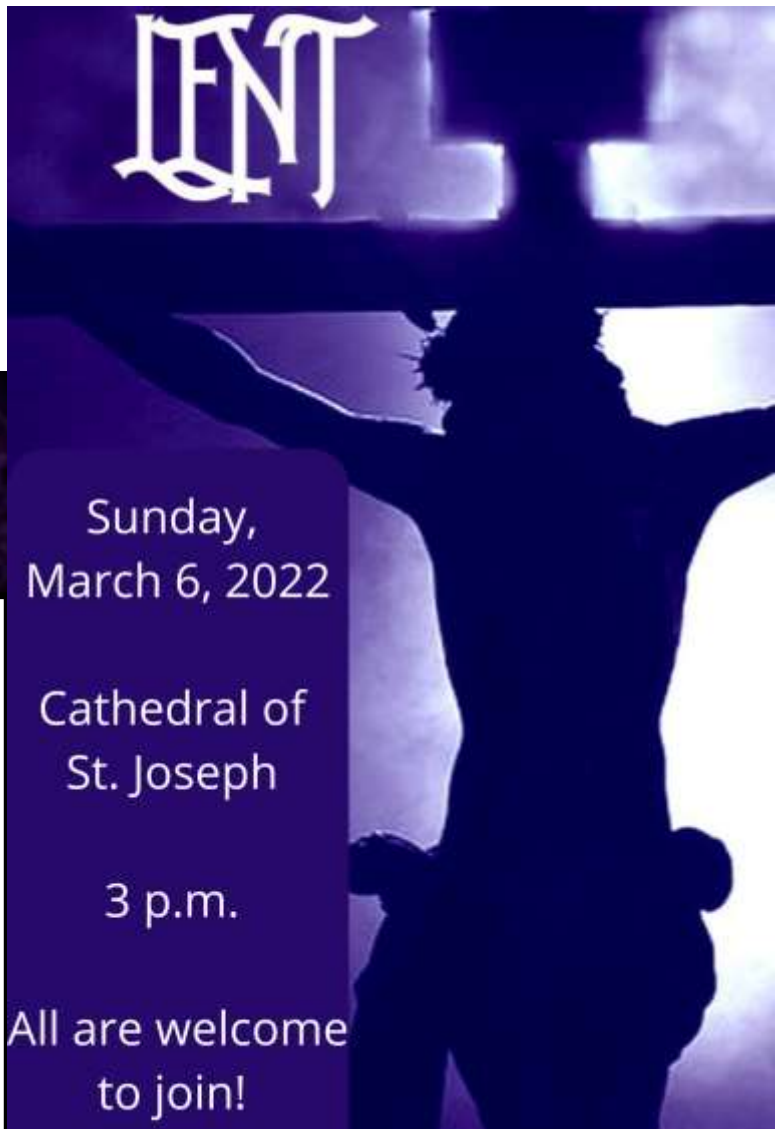

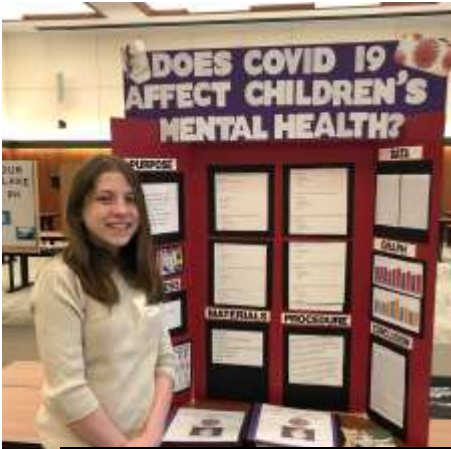

Introduction to Prayer Cycle 2 Mar 7-Apr 9

"Prayer is our means of taking a sighting, of re-orienting ourselves – by re-establishing contact with our goal. In the presence of God many components of our life fall into perspective and our journey makes more sense. Prayer is inseparable from living" (Casey, p.5). This course explores prayer as essential to our lives as Christian people, as individuals and within our community of faith. Through this course, students will explore the qualities, forms and expressions of prayer that help to form and sustain our lives as Catholic Christians. By the end of the course we will have:

- Understood the nature, aims, efficacy, and types of prayer
- Explored prayer as revealed in Sacred Scripture and the Tradition of our Catholic faith
- Explained the interrelated nature of personal prayer and the liturgical life of the Church
- Understood the relation between prayer united with Jesus and growth in discipleship.
- Developed, enriched, or sustained their prayer life as a result of the course content

This class is offered by the Diocese of Wheeling Charleston through the VLCFF (Virtual Learning Community For Faith Formation) of the University of Dayton. This is a hybrid course consisting of both online components and a two hour weekly zoom meeting. The course is five weeks long and can be taken for credit towards catechetical certification, or as an audit for ongoing faith formation.

The course will be facilitated by Dr. Rodica Stoicoiu.

The Church as the Sacrament of Salvation

In the previous essay, we saw that Jesus, as foretold in the Old Testament, obediently suffered death on the cross. Jesus redeemed us from our sins and reconciled us to the Father by His suffering (Isaiah 53: 5). Christ accomplished His saving work on the cross once and for all (Hebrews 7: 27; Hebrews 10: 1-18); nevertheless, it is very important to know how Christ



communicates and makes present to us the grace that comes from His death. In this essay, we will see how the Church can be viewed as the sacrament of salvation (but is not itself one of the seven sacraments).

Just as Christ was sent by the Father, Christ sent the Apostles (John 20:21). He sent them so that they might preach the Gospel to all the nations (Matthew 28: 16-19). The Gospel is the

good news that the Son of God by his death and resurrection has freed us from our sins and reconciled us to Himself (Romans 5: 19-21). The grace from Christ's redemptive death opened the door to our salvation (Hebrews 10: 10-14).

It is through the sacraments, however, that Christ communicates and makes present to us the grace from His redemptive death (Sacrosanctum Concilium 61; Catechism of the Catholic Church, CCC, 1084).

The seven sacraments are visible signs by which the Holy Spirit makes present the invisible grace of salvation (CCC, 1084). For example, the water and words used during baptism are visible signs (the instrument) by which grace is made present to us, the removal of original and actual sin (CCC, 1234). Like Christ and the sacraments, the Church is both human and divine, visible but endowed with invisible realities.

St. Paul calls the Church the Body of Christ (1 Corinthians 12: 12-20; Colossians 1:18). Merely belonging to the Church does not make someone holy (1 Corinthians 5: 1-2), nevertheless, the Church is like a sacrament. The Church, the Body of Christ, is like a sacrament because it is the instrument through which men are brought into communion with God (Lumen Gentium 1; 9; 48).

It is through Christ's Body (the Church) that we receive the grace of Christ's sacrifice on the cross.

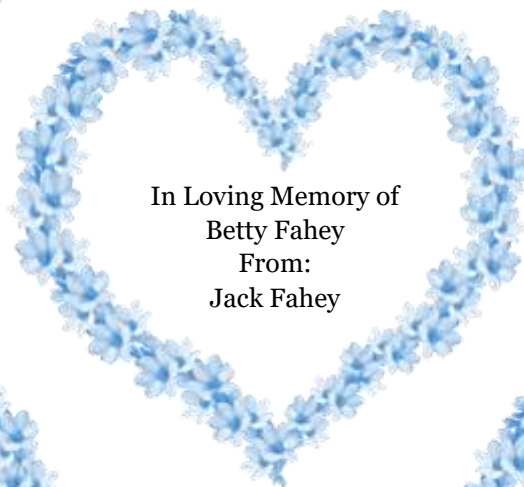
