## Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

## Second Sunday in Ordinary 7ime

At the wedding which Jesus attended at Cana of Galilee, there was great joy but a problem developed. There was a shortage of wine. Not only was that a social embarrassment, it was also a bad symbol. Mary says to Jesus they have no wine. There is no more joy; no more glass raised, no more celebration.

What are they telling us, both Mary and Jesus? God's gifts to individuals are not meant primarily, for their personal or their families benefit, but for the service of others. That is what St. Paul is telling us, in the second reading, when he enumerates the many different gifts of the Holy Spirit to different persons, but not for personal profit.

Let's invite Jesus in our lives as the wedding party at Cana invited Jesus. When Jesus is at our side, we shall always be richly provided and insured with his protection and blessings. Let us invite Jesus and Mary to remain with us in our homes when we feel shortages in our family lives. The spouses need Jesus and Mary when their dreams are gone, mutual love is dried up, the relationship becomes boring and raising the children becomes a burden draining all their energy. Just as Jesus filled the empty water jars with wine, let us fill the empty hearts around us with love. By the miracle of Cana, Jesus challenges us also to enrich the empty lives of those around us with the new wine of love, mercy, concern and care.

Are you a life-long learner?




## WHY WE KNEEL IN CHURCH

## The meaning of kneeling:

We know God is present in the Eucharist, so, we kneel. It is a position of respect for God. It is a position of humility for ourselves. It physically demonstrates our spiritual attitude of adoration. It also is a position of weakness showing we know God is powerful and we trust him.

## What the Bible says about kneeling:

Kneeling before God is serious business in the Bible. The lepers asking Jesus to heal them kneel. [Mark 1:40] The



## Catholic Tradition on Kneeling:

General Instruction of the Roman Missal at 43 provides: "In the Dioceses of the United States of America, they should kneel beginning after the singing or recitation of the Sanctus (Holy, Holy, Holy) until after the Amen of the Eucharistic Prayer, except when prevented on occasion by ill health, or for reasons of lack of space, of the large number of people present, or for another reasonable cause. However, those who do not kneel ought to make a profound bow when the Priest genuflects after the Consecration."

So, the Church follows the Bible. If we are healthy enough we do what Jesus did, and Paul, and Peter and just about any other reverent person did: we kneel.


