

# Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

#### Third Sunday in Ordinary Time

"A purpose gives meaning to life. It is like the hub in a wheel, with very spoke filled into it to make a strong and perfect circle. Without such a hub, the spokes will not rotate evenly and your wheel will lack strength, will tend to break apart on the first good hump it hits. Given a strong hub, a strong purpose, a person can take a surprising number of shocks and bumps on outside rim without sustaining permanent damage"- O.C. Hobby. A clear purpose give meaning to Jesus' life. He had a strong determination to go ahead. No wonder He was able to take a surprising number of shocks and bumps on the outside rim without suffering serious setbacks.

At Nazareth, when Jesus stood up to read in the synagogue, and He found the perfect description of the mission He was called to fulfill: to preach the good news to the poor; to set at liberty those who are oppressed; to proclaim the acceptable year of the Lord. The first thing is that Jesus came with good news. The good news must not be limited to spiritual blessings only. The poor are all the wounded and little ones; the blind, the oppressed, the captives, and all those who are waiting for liberator. The message for them is one of hope, of healing and of liberation. Jesus' mission is still to give liberation to everyone who will listen to his "Good News," accept it and put it into practice.

Each insert will only take a few minutes to read. Easy, yes. But, the longest journey is begun by mere footsteps. Reading these inserts will be a few steps on your journey in this world to be with God forever in the next.

The second one, included with this weeks bulletin addresses: Why We Have a Tabernacle.

## Why We Have a Tabernacle

#### What is the Tabernacle:

The word tabernacle means "dwelling place." The tabernacle in Church is so named because it is a place where Christ dwells in the Eucharist. It is a place of respect for the Eucharist. It also keeps the Eucharist safe between masses. That's why it is of solid construction and is kept locked.




The red candle (sanctuary lamp) is lit whenever the consecrated host is inside. It symbolizes the true presence of Christ.



#### What the Bible says about the Tabernacle:

The Tabernacle is referenced over 100 times in the Bible and is discussed in both the Old and New Testaments. With Jesus' resurrection the role of the tabernacle was changed and how one approaches the tabernacle changed.



The Old Testament tabernacle was very large and had multiple rooms. While the people could enter the outer courtyard they could go no further. Only priests could approach God in the Holy Place. Only the high priest could enter the Holy of Holies. A veil seperated these two places. This is the veil that was torn at the moment of Jesus' death. We read this every Easter in Matthew 27:51, Mark 15:38, and Luke 23:45.

Jesus replaced the high priest and removed the barrier between us and God. *Id*, Hebrews 8.

Each of us can now approach the tabernacle of God with a repentant heart.

#### Catholic Tradition on the Tabernacle:

#### Code of Canon Law, 938

- §1. The Most Holy Eucharist is to be reserved habitually in only one tabernacle of a church or oratory.
- §2. The tabernacle in which the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved is to be situated in some part of the church or oratory which is distinguished, conspicuous, beautifully decorated, and suitable for prayer.
- §3. The tabernacle in which the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved habitually is to be immovable, made of solid and opaque material, and locked in such a way that the danger of profanation is avoided as much as possible.

#### Code of Canon Law, 940

A special lamp which indicates and honors the presence of Christ is to shine continuously before a tabernacle in which the Most Holy Eucharist is reserved.


