

Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Most of the time we like people who please us, who say nice things about us, and do not confront us. We prefer small talk and wish to maintain peace at any cost. But there are people who feel compelled to speak out, who will challenge wrong doing even if it makes them unpopular. These are the prophets of our day! Every true believer is called to be a prophet, to be the mouthpiece of God. In today's reading we hear of Jeremiah's vocation to be a prophet. The Lord tells him that he was chosen for the task even before he was born, that he was consecrated in his mother's womb. The calling of a prophet was not an easy task. Jeremiah, like any true prophet, was rejected by the people but he carried on. Today's gospel we notice that initially people were in admiration and wondered at his eloquence. But they could not accept his teachings because he was one of them. They wanted to throw him out. Jesus replied, "No prophet is accepted in his own land!" Today's gospel reminds us that we need to face rejection prophetic courage and optimism. Secondly, we need to follow Christ, not political correctness, and to speak the truth of Christ without being hypocritical or disrespectful.

2022-2023 DIOCESAN TUITION ASSISTANCE PROCESS IS OPENING SOON

For the 31* consecutive year, the Diocesan Tuition Assistance Program (TAP) is striving to keep Catholic school education affordable for Catholic families who desire it for their children but who may need some financial assistance to make that dream a reality. Thanks to the ongoing and genuine commitment of The Most Reverend Mark Brennan to the Catholic schools in our Diocese, funds have, once again, been allocated for distribution to Catholic families in need of financial assistance.

Applying for **TAP through FACTS** is easy and affordable. You are encouraged to apply if your child is already enrolled or has been accepted by one of the Catholic schools in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston for the 2022-2023 school year.

Who is eligible? Any Catholic student accepted for the 2022-2023 school year in any Diocesan Catholic school (PK thru grade 12) and who belongs to a parish included on the drop-down list as part of the on-line application is eligible. Determinations are based upon a family's degree of need relative to all other applicants.

How do I apply? Applications are made on-line. Go to <u>www.factsmgt.com</u>, click on "Grant & Aid Assessment" and log in. If you do not have Internet access, contact your school office for assistance.

Cost? The application fee is \$35. The Diocese will pay \$17.50 and families pay the other \$17.50.

Grants: Diocesan grants for Catholic families who have completed their applications and show financial need will receive **up to 50%** of the child's tuition.

Phase I Deadline In order to receive notification in late May, applications (including all required April 29, 2022 documentation and payment of the fee) are to be received by FACTS by April 29, 2022.

Phase I is intended for families with children currently enrolled or already accepted for the 2022-2023 school year in any Catholic school in the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston.

Phase II Deadline In order to receive notification in early September, all applications for 2022-2023 (including August 31, 2022 <u>all required documentation and payment of the fee</u>) MUST be RECEIVED by FACTS no later

than August 31, 2022. This is a firm deadline. Phase II is intended for families new to the school or who have had a life-changing event (i.e. birth, death, loss of job, major illness). If an application was submitted during Phase I, please contact the school. Please do NOT submit a second application.

Note 1: No assistance will be available from the Diocese or from any school unless:

an application is completed in full (ALL questions answered) and submitted all required documentation is provided, **AND**

the family portion (\$17.50) of the application fee is paid by the deadline.

Note 2: ONLY ONE APPLICATION PER FAMILY should be submitted per school year. If you made an error or had a life event change, please do NOT submit a second application. Contact your principal and your application can be updated by FACTS.

Catholic schools throughout the Diocese of Wheeling-Charleston are preparing for the 2022-2023 school year with their common application and re-enrollment period beginning in February. Schools are also preparing to welcome new students taking advantage of the HOPE SCHOLARSHIP - set to open March 2022

According to the Treasurer's website, hopescholarshipwv.com, students are eligible for the program if they are: 1. A resident of WV, 2. Entering Kindergarten for the first time, 3. Current K-11 student enrolled at least 45 days in a WV public school in the 2021-2022 school year.

The stie also states that under the current school aid formula, each eligible student would receive \$4600 annually that can be used toward private school, alternative instruction programs, or home school. Meaning of Marriage



Real Marriage:

Marriage has been around for thousands of years. (Long before governments began to redefine marriage.) Marriage, founded in love, is a restricted covenant between a qualified man and woman by which they freely yield to and accept from each other the perpetual and exclusive right to the marital act. The first purpose of this union is having and educating children and doing everything possible to ensure your spouse and children go to heaven; the mutual comfort and supporting of the spouses is its secondary purpose.

What the Bible says about marriage:

God created Marriage and it is never taken lightly in the Bible in both the Old and New Testament. God created humankind in his image, "in the image of God he created them; male and female, God blessed them, and God said to them, 'Be fruitful and multiply, and fill the earth and subdue it.' " [Genesis 1:27-28] It is man's duty to dedicate his life to his spouse "Therefore a man leaves his father and mother and clings to his wife, and they become one flesh." [Genesis 2:24] accord: [Mathew 19:6, Mark 10:8] So, they are no longer two, but one flesh. Therefore, what God has joined together, let no one separate. Id. God's plan is simply, one man marries one woman and they don't get divorced.

Catholic Tradition on Marriage:

The Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC) follows the Bible very closely. It also focuses on mutual consent. See: Art. 7 Section III.

A valid Catholic marriage results from four elements:

- the spouses are free to marry;
- (2) they freely exchange their consent;
- (3) in consenting to marry, they have the intention to marry for life, to be faithful to one another and be open to children; and
- (4) their consent is given in the canonical form, i.e., in the presence of two witnesses and before a properly authorized church minister.













The Church also wants Marriages to succeed and not end in divorce. To this end the Church provides classes several months before marriage to help the participants inform their consent and plan to build a successful marriage. During or before this time, the would-be spouses are confirmed if they have not previously received confirmation and it can be done without grave inconvenience (Canon 1065).

THE CATECHISM SPECIFICALLY PROVIDES:

"Christ dwells with [the married couple], gives them the strength to take up their crosses and so follow him, to rise again after they have fallen, to forgive one another, to bear one another's burdens, to 'be subject to one another out of reverence for Christ,' and to love one another with supernatural, tender, and fruitful love. In the joys of their love and family life he gives them here on earth a foretaste of the wedding feast of the Lamb." CCC at 1642.
