

Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

It is beautiful to observe a creative ritual at some weddings where the groom and bride come to the wedding ceremony, each holding a candle. At the ceremony they are asked to use their two candles and light a single candle. Afterwards, they blow off their candles to leave the single one burning. This creative rite is symbolic to show that they are no longer two but one. What is more, it is a sign of a break with past life, and embracing a new life, and a permanent decision to remain one. Today's readings are about God's call and man's commitment in answer to that call. First reading, Elijah came upon Elisha, as he was ploughing the field with twelve yoke of oxen. Elijah went over to him and threw his cloak on him. Throwing the cloak on Elisha meant that Elijah was passing over the mantle of authority upon him and calling him to take on a new responsibility to be a prophet. Without hesitation, Elisha accepted the new vocation by taking the voke of oxen and slaughtered them and used the ploughing equipment to boil the flesh of the oxen and distributed it to the people to eat. In doing so, he blocked the chances of reverting to farming in the near or distant future. We too, are asked to follow Jesus, totally and immediately, without any reservations, both by giving priority to him and to his cause and by surrendering our lives to God in humble and dedicated service to others.





Sacrament of Holy Orders

In the previous essay, we considered the Anointing of the Sick. It is important to remember that all the sacraments make some aspect of Christ's saving work on earth present to us today, and so must be understood through the life of Christ. However, it is also important not to forget that the seven sacraments are foreshadowed in the Old Testament. This essay will be about the sacrament of Holy Orders.




A primary purpose of the Old Testament priesthood was to offer sacrifices for the atonement of sins on behalf of the Israelites. For example, "the priest shall next offer the purification offering, thus making atonement on behalf of the one being purified from the uncleanness." (Leviticus 14: 19; see also, Leviticus 5: 12-13). But, St. Paul says that "every priest stands daily at his ministry, offering frequently those same sacrifices that can never take away sins. But this one [Jesus] offered one sacrifice for sins, and took his seat forever at the right hand of God" (Hebrews 10: 11-12). Here, St. Paul is saying that the sacrifices required by the Jewish law do not take away our sins. Rather, he goes on to emphasize that Christ's sacrificial death on the cross has the power to rescue us from sin.

In the Gospels, Christ is frequently portrayed as the good shepherd who leads His sheep (John 10: 11-16; Mark 6: 34; Matthew 26: 31). A central part of Christ's ministry here on earth is to lead and grow His flock. After rising His death, Jesus conferred the role of shepherd to His apostles.

For example, Jesus said to Peter three times, "Simon, son of John, do you love me?" Peter ... said to him, "Lord, you know everything; you know that I love you." [Jesus] said to him, "Feed my sheep" (John 15-17; see also, 1 Peter 5: 1-4).

Jesus gave Peter the authority to be a shepherd. Those who were given the authority of "shepherd" passed on their authority in a line of succession down to the priests and bishops we have today.

Finally, like the priests of the Old Testament, the priests of the new covenant also offer sacrifice. But, rather than sacrificing goats and oxen, priests today offer the sacrifice of the eucharist (CCC 1367).





In the words of the Catechism, "the Eucharist is thus a sacrifice because it re-presents (makes present) the sacrifice of the cross" (CCC 1366). When the Priest says the words of consecration, He literally makes present before us the sacrifice of Christ (CCC 1365).

In the next essay, we will consider the sacrament of Marriage.




