Father Paul's Reflections

on the Readings

Third Sunday of Lent

The first reading describes how God provided water to the ungrateful complainers of Israel, thus placing Jesus' promise within the context of the Exodus account of water coming from the rock at Horeb. In the second reading, Saint Paul asserts that Jesus poured the living water of the gift of the Holy Spirit into our hearts. Today's Gospel tells us how Jesus awakened in the woman at the well a thirst for the wholeness and integrity which she had lost, a thirst which He had come to satisfy. A Samaritan woman is given an opportunity to receive the living water. She opened her heart to Jesus and her life is different. She left her water jar! She has new water and a new life. She goes to town, a town in which she had been humiliatingly rejected, and she boldly calls people together to tell them about this incredible man she has met. She says: he told me everything I have ever done. Suddenly she is no longer burdened by her past life. Her guilt and sin are not the focus. We need to allow Jesus free entry into our personal lives. Let us have the courage to "be" Jesus for others, especially in those "unexpected" places for "unwanted" people.

Come experience The Sacrament of God's Forgiveness

Please take time to experience the Sacrament of **God's Forgiveness. The emphasis of** reconciliation is not just that we are all sinners, but rather that God wants to offer sinners forgiveness of offenses committed against Him.

What Is Sacrament of Reconciliation?

Reconciliation (also known as confession) is a sacrament instituted by Jesus Christ in his love and mercy to offer sinners forgiveness for offenses committed against God. At the same time, sinners reconcile with the Church, because it is also wounded by our sins. Every time we sin, we hurt ourselves, other people, and God. In Reconciliation, we acknowledge our sins before God and his Church. We express our sorrow in a meaningful way, receive the forgiveness of Christ and his Church, make reparation for what we have done, and resolve to do better in the future.

The forgiveness of sins involves four parts:

Contrition: a sincere sorrow for having offended God, and the most important act of the penitent. There can be no forgiveness of sin if we do not have sorrow and a firm resolve not to repeat our sin.

Confession: confronting our sins in a profound way to God by speaking about them, aloud, to the priest.

Penance: an important part of our healing is the "penance" the priest imposes in reparation for our sins.

Absolution: the priest speaks the words by which "God, the Father of Mercies" reconciles a sinner to himself through the merits of the Cross.

How to Make a Good Confession

Confession is not difficult, but it does require preparation. We should begin with prayer, placing ourselves in the presence of God, our loving Father. We seek healing and forgiveness through repentance and a resolve to sin no more. Then we review our lives since our last confession, searching our thoughts, words, and actions for that which did not conform to God's command to love him and one another through his laws and the laws of his Church. This is called an examination of conscience.

Begin with a prayer asking for God's help. Review your life with the help of some questions, which are based on the Ten Commandments. Tell God how truly sorry you are for your sins. Make a firm resolution not to sin again.

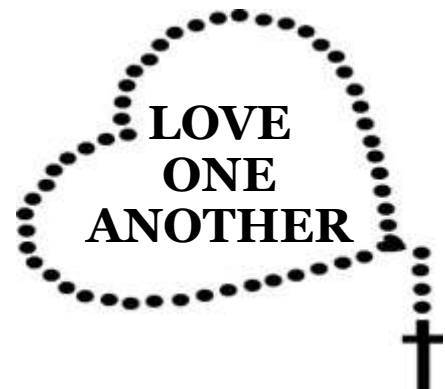
