

# **Father Paul's Reflections** on the Readings

Second Sunday in Lent

On Tabor Jesus felt comforted and affirmed. He knew that the Father was pleased with him and would give him all the strength he would need to face whatever lay ahead. At times, life could be dark for us and we too need to hear those reassuring words: "You are my son the beloved, my favor rests on you." People from time to time do affirm us, but their affirmation is conditional. "You are good but you need to change your behavior"! Only God affirms us exactly as he affirmed his son Jesus. Our problem is that as soon as we run into trouble our faith fails us. We think that God has abandoned us. In the moments of trial, we want to flee. We forget that, our Lord did not promise us a rose garden, but a garden of Gethsemane and a crown of thorns. Today Jesus challenges us to come away from, where we are to where Jesus is. Jesus' transfiguration gives us a message of hope encouragement. In moments of doubt, pain and suffering, disappointment and despair, we need mountain-top experiences to reach out to God and listen to His consoling words: "This is my beloved son/daughter in whom I am well pleased."

Heavenly Father,



# The Hierarchy of the Church

In the previous essay, we saw that there were three marks of unity within the Church: 1) the profession of the true faith, 2) the communion of the sacraments, and 3) subjection to the legitimate pastor, the Roman Pontiff. In this essay, we will focus on where the third mark of unity, the authority of the pope and bishops, the successors of the apostles, is found in scripture.

First, not all people in the Church have the same authority or "job" that the bishops do. Consider the words of St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 12: 27-31, "Some people God has designated in the church to be, first, apostles; second, prophets; third, teachers; then, mighty deeds; then, gifts of healing, assistance, administration, and varieties of tongues.

Are all apostles? Are all prophets?

Are all teachers? Do all work mighty deeds?"

Here, St. Paul emphasizes that there is diversity within the one body of the Church (see also, Ephesians 4: 11). Not

everyone has the same role. He explicitly designates apostles as "first" within the body of Christ. In other words, the apostles are entrusted with the task of ordering or governing the body of Christ.



Even in the very early Church, there was a governing structure present. For example, the apostles elect people into their own order (Acts 1: 15-26) and delegate tasks to subordinates beneath them (Acts 6: 1-4). At the very beginning of the Acts of the Apostles (Acts 1: 15-26), a successor was chosen for Judas. The successor "was counted with the eleven

God's people for works of service, so that the body of Christ may be built up

apostles" and given the same office that Judas had. Similarly, St Paul appointed others, such as Timothy and Titus, to organize and govern the Church, each in their distinct region (2 Timothy 2: 1-2; Titus 1: 5). The pope and bishops of the Church today can trace their line of succession back to these first bishops who then appointed other bishops and so on.

Just as the twelve apostles were called apart and given special authority by Christ (Matthew 10:1-4; Matthew 18: 18; John 20: 23), so too was Peter set at the head of the apostles. For example, in the Gospel of Matthew (Matthew 10: 2), he is specifically designated as "first" when the apostles are named together. Similarly, Christ promises only to Peter the responsibility of holding the "keys to the kingdom of heaven" (Matthew 16: 19). Peter is specifically singled out and promised that "whatever you bind on earth shall be bound




