

Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

Fourth Sunday in Lent

There are three turning points in the story of the prodigal son. 1. He turned away. Prodigal son turned away from his father's house. This was a disastrous turning. He was not satisfied with his rights, his dignity and his security. So he turned away from him. While turning away, he put his trust in wrong things. He believed that his wealth and money would bring him joy and happiness. Today's gospel says, squandered his money in dissolute living." Later, he hired himself as a swineherd and was even happy to eat the pods, which the pigs eat. I remember poster, "freedom is appreciated until it is lost". Sometimes, children don't appreciate their parents care and concern; sinners, often don't appreciate God's saving grace. 2. He turned inwards. In his misery, the prodigal son turned inwards. He began to think sensibly. He thought himself, "I have made a mess of my life. But I can redeem myself by returning to my father". His introspection led him to his redemption. 3. He turned towards. The prodigal son turned towards his father's house. He made a decision. I will arise and go to my father and say, "I am not worthy to be called your son; treat me like one of your hired hands". Central point in today's gospel is, tuning away from Jesus, there is misery, wretchedness and death; turning towards him, there is joy and life. Christ used parables like a mirror, so that each one of us could look into it and see ourselves in the story: the ingratitude, the irresponsibility and the ultimate repentance of the prodigal son. Jesus invited us to admire the forgiveness, generosity and patience of the father.

The Council of Trent on Justification

A central aspect of the Catholic faith is how we, that is, sinful human beings, are "saved" or "justified". First, it is important to remember that we are saved from the guilt inherited from the sin of Adam and Eve (original sin) and the sins that we have personally committed. Through sin, we have dug an uncrossable chasm that separates us from God. There is nothing we can do to cross the chasm and be with God in heaven. A person who is justified has been healed by God from the wounds of sin and can cross the chasm.

More specifically, justification refers to the way sinners, all of us here on earth, become

- 1) reconciled to God,
- 2) sharers in God's holiness, and
- 3) worthy of eternal life with God in heaven.

In this essay and those in the weeks to come, we will consider many different aspects of our justification.

Today, we will focus on what the Church taught about the justification of sinners at the Council of Trent. First, God's grace is necessary to our justification, we cannot be made holy by ourselves. At the same time, we must freely assent to and cooperate with God's offer of salvation (Trent, Session 6, Chapter 5). For example, imagine that you are trying to lift a very heavy refrigerator—by yourself, it is impossible. Only if you cooperate with someone else can you lift it. We cannot overcome the weight of sin by ourselves, but we can by accepting God's help.

Also, we must be predisposed towards God's saving grace through the faith that we sinners are, "justified by God ... through the redemption that is in Christ Jesus" (Trent, Session 6, Chapter 6). After all, if someone does not believe that Christ died for their sins, they are not in a position to accept God's offer of salvation. While faith is a part of our justification, faith by itself is not enough, and "unless hope and charity be added to it, it

neither unites man perfectly with Christ nor makes him a living member of His body" (Trent, Session 6, Chapter 7). However, faith is necessary to our justification.

Finally, let's think about why we are saved, who saves us, how we are saved, and what happens when we are saved. The reason **why** God redeemed us from sin is so that we may have eternal life with Him and to make His goodness and glory known to us. It is God Himself **who** redeemed us, through the merit of His Son's redemptive death on the cross. The **way** (how) God communicates redemption to us and washes us clean from the stain of original sin is through the sacrament of baptism; which receives its cleansing power from the merit of Christ's redeeming death. Finally, **what** happens to us when we receive redemption from sin through baptism is that we are made just or righteous (see the first paragraph), each "according to ...[his] disposition and cooperation" (Trent, Session 6, Chapter 7).




