



First Sunday in Lent

We begin the first Sunday of Lent reflecting on temptations of Jesus. The readings of this Sunday contrast the power of good with the power of evil. In all the three temptations Jesus uses the scripture references to refuse the tempter (Deut. 8:3; 6:13,16). In the first, Jesus is tempted to use His power to perform a miracle to satisfy His hunger. Jesus affirms that humans don't live by bread alone, but by the word of God (cf. John 6: 27). So the food and our bodily needs are not the 'be all and end all' in human life. We need to strive for greater things. The second one tempts Jesus to worship the tempter rather than the Creator. If any person, possessions or ideology is given the place of God, it is equal to idol worship. Let us give to God what belongs to God. In the third temptation, the devil tempts Jesus to bend the will of God to His own will. Jesus rightly responds, "You shall not put the Lord your God to the test". As humans we should bend our will to the plan of God, not the other way around. We need to discern and do the will of God.


The Unity in the Church

In the previous essay, we saw that the church was like a sacrament, the instrument by which Christ communicates salvation to the world. Today, we will examine St. Paul's description of the church as the one Body of Christ and where marks of unity within the church can be found.

Consider the words of St. Paul in 1 Corinthians 12: 12-20, "As a body is one though it has many parts, and all the parts of the body, though many, are one body, so also Christ...whether Jews or Greeks, slaves

or free persons... as it is, there are many parts, yet one body" (see also, John 17: 20-23; Colossians 1: 17-20). Here, St. Paul is emphasizing unity in the Church. Just like there are many parts to one body. there are many different members in the Church. However, his reason for pointing out the different members is to show how they all have something in common. This common unity is that we belong to the same body, the body of Christ.

Traditionally, the Church has understood the unity in the body of Christ that St Paul speaks about (or membership in the Church) to consist of three things. They are, as the great saint Robert Bellarmine



up of one part but of many ... Now you are the body of Christ, and each one of you is a part of it." put it, "[1] the profession of the true faith, [2] the communion of the sacraments, and [3] subjection to the legitimate pastor, the Roman Pontiff" (De Controversiis, On the Church Militant, pg. 10). It should be noted that possession of the above three marks of unity is not enough to make one holy and is not enough to attain salvation.

WHAT IS PENTER



Pentecost (from the Greek word "Pentecoste" meaning "50th day") is the one of the most prominent feast days in the Christian calendar. It is often referred to as the "birthday of the Church."

It marks the day, nearly 2,000 years ago, when the Holy Spirit descended upon the Apostles, who had been living in fear for fifty days following the resurrection of Jesus Christ on Easter Sunday.

Emboldened by the Holy Spirit, the apostles set forth to tell all people in Jerusalem of the Resurrection. As they spoke in tounges given to them by the Holy Spirit, all nationalities present could understand them in their own mother tongue

Let us think about why each of the above are a mark of unity within the Church.

THE PROFESSION OF THE TRUE FAITH

(1) is a mark of unity because we believe in the same things, both among all members of the Church today and those in the past all the way to the beginning of the Church.

THE SACRAMENTS ARE A MARK OF UNITY

(2) because from the beginning of the Church until now the sacraments have ordered the life of the Church and made present to us the grace from Christ's death on the cross. Finally,

THE HIERARCHAL STRUCTURE OF THE CHURCH

(3) is a mark of unity because through it we receive many of the sacraments and are linked to the start of the Church at Pentecost (Acts 1-2).

In the sixth essay, we will focus on the third attribute of unity in the Church; the authority of the pope and bishops, the successors of the apostles, as found in scripture.
