## Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

Third Sunday of Easter

In the Gospel, we have the miracle of the great catch at Lake Tiberius. Peter says, "I am going out for fishing". They started to fish: they were trained, experienced people. They have worked for a whole night, but have not achieved anything. The disciples once discouraged totally because of the absence of Jesus and discovering that their hard labor provided no returns to find everything in Jesus, which transforms them into his loyal disciples. There comes the sound from the safe shores, "Cast your net on the right side". Sometimes a minor change of direction may be enough to gain success. But the gloom of the impending failure makes vision blurred. In our journey through life, we are also confronted with several problems and difficulties which can make us lose our perspective. We can lose direction life to and remain helpless. There are moments when we feel that all is lost and the Lord has forgotten us. An external divine prompting is necessary at such times. The disciples won't lose anything by following the Master's orders. They will only gain. Keep the mind and heart open to receive the promptings of the Spirit. Expect a miracle – make miracles happen.

### The Sacrament of Baptism


In the previous essay, we considered the sacraments in general. It is important to remember that all the sacraments make some aspect of Christ's saving work on earth present to us today, and so must be understood through the life of Christ. We will now consider each of the sacraments individually. This essay will be about Baptism.

Baptism washes us clean from our original and actual sin. It should come as no surprise then, that we can see the sacrament of baptism prefigured through the use of water in the Old Testament (Ezekiel 36: 25-27). For example, the waters of the flood wash the earth clean of sinful people (Genesis 6: 5-7; 7: 10-12). The Israelites cross the waters of the Red Sea, passing from slavery in Egypt to the new life promised to them by God (Exodus 14: 10-31; see also, Joshua 3).

### Throughout the Old Testament, water represents new life.

In the New Testament, Christ transformed and elevated water to a new purpose, the cleansing and forgiveness of sin.

Christ pays the debt for our sins because we are not able to—he takes our sins upon himself and atones for them on the cross (1 Peter 2:24). Consider these words of St. Paul, "are you unaware that we who were baptized into Christ Jesus were baptized into his death? We were indeed buried with him through baptism into death, so that, just as Christ was raised from the dead by the glory of the Father, we too might live in newness of life" (Romans 6: 3-5, see also Titus 3: 3-7). St. Paul tells us that the saving grace from Christ's death is made present to us through the waters of baptism. Christ paid for our sins through the death of His body, baptism unites us to the body of Christ and so makes us sharers in His redeeming sacrifice.

St. Paul goes on to emphasize that, "our old self was crucified with Him, so that our sinful body might be done away with, that we might no longer be in slavery to sin" (Romans 6: 6). St. Paul affirms that the waters of baptism eradicate all of our sins—i.e., our sinful body is gone and we are made new in Christ (see also, Acts 22: 16). However, in the same letter, St. Paul says that "I see in my members another principle at war with the law of my mind, taking me captive to the law of sin that dwells in my members" (Romans 7: 13-25).

If baptism cleansed us from all our sins, then what could St. Paul mean by the sin that dwells in his members? Here, St. Paul is not literally speaking of sin. Rather, he identifies "in our members" the inclination towards sin. In other words, we have had our sins removed and forgiven through Baptism. But, there is still within us the tendency to keep sinning. This tendency toward sin is not itself sinful, but often leads us to sin.


