





#### Fifth Sunday of Easter

The theme that dominates the readings of today is love and service. Jesus told his disciples to love one another as he himself had loved them. Jesus reminds us that love is the soul of our Christian life. Love involves total giving, and sacrificing oneself. In the gospel Jesus says, "Love one another as I have loved you. Mother Teresa said: "True love causes pain". To love means to go beyond ourselves to rise above our own need, to stretch out to someone to see the faces of those who desperately need our love, and indeed, to give ourselves to others. If you really love one another, you will not be able to avoid making sacrifices. That is why, in our experience true love hurts. But the hurt becomes bearable, and even meaningful and necessary because it is borne out of love. That is precisely the difference between a donation and a sacrifice. A donation is something that comes out of the pocket; a sacrifice comes out of the heart. And God is asking for sacrifice, something painful because it is what we give from our hearts filled with love.

### The Sacrament of the Eucharist



In the previous essay, we considered the sacrament of Confirmation. It is important to remember that all the sacraments make some aspect of Christ's saving work on earth present to us today, and so must be understood through the life of Christ. However, it is also important not to forget that the seven sacraments are foreshadowed in the Old Testament. This essay will be about the Eucharist.

In the Old Testament, we can see the eucharist foreshadowed in Isaac. Isaac asked where the lamb for sacrifice was (Genesis 22: 7); Abraham replied that "God

will provide the sheep for the burnt offering" (Genesis 22: 8). But, a lamb was not sacrificed on that day, a ram was (Genesis 22: 13). Abraham's mention of a sheep for sacrifice looks forward to the sacrifice of the Lamb of God. Similarly, the lamb that the Israelites sacrificed and ate on Passover became a symbol of their freedom from slavery (Exodus 12: 1-13).

In the New Testament, upon seeing Jesus, John the Baptist said, "behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world" (John 1:29). Similarly, the soldiers did not break Jesus' bones, though the bones of the criminals beside him were, "so that the scripture passage might be fulfilled" (John 19: 36). The scripture that is fulfilled, of course, is from the Passover in Exodus (Exodus 12: 46). Christ is the new Passover lamb because it is through His death, the death of the Lamb, that we are saved from our sins.



Just like the Israelites were commanded to eat the lamb that was slain, Christ said to his apostles that **"unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink his blood, [or] you do not have life within you"** (John 6: 53). In Luke's Gospel, when celebrating Passover with His apostles, Christ commanded them to "do this in memory of me" (Luke 22: 19). But, we are not merely remembering Christ's sacrifice on the cross like the Jews remember their liberation from Egypt at Passover. Rather, according to the words of Christ

(John 6: 22-59), the bread and wine are transformed into the same body and blood which Christ sacrificed on the cross for the forgiveness of our sins (CCC 1365-1367).

It is important to note that there is a significant difference between the Eucharist and the flesh and blood that a cannibal consumes. While truly the flesh and blood of Christ, the Eucharist does not typically have the physical qualities of flesh such as muscle and tissue, etc. **Rather, the physical qualities of bread and wine remain even once the Eucharist is transformed into the flesh and blood of Christ.** If this explanation leaves you uncomfortable, this is good because the Eucharist is a mystery and not to be regarded as commonplace.
