

Fourth Sunday of Easter





The Sacrament of Confirmation



In the previous essay, we considered the sacrament of Baptism. It is important to remember that all the sacraments make some aspect of Christ's saving work on earth present to us today, and so must be understood through the life of Christ. However, it is also important not to forget that the seven sacraments are foreshadowed in the Old Testament. This essay will be about Confirmation.

We can see the foreshadowing of the sacrament of Confirmation in the Old Testament through the anointing with oil. For example, God commanded Moses

to anoint Aaron and his sons with oil so that they could serve God as priests (Exodus 40: 12-15). Also, Samuel anointed both Saul (1 Samuel 10: 1) and David (1 Samuel 16: 13) as kings of Israel. As the Catechism puts it, "in Israel those consecrated to God for a mission that He gave were anointed in His name" (CCC, 436).

In the Old Testament, anointing with oil was a sign that someone was set apart and given a special mission by God.

In the New Testament, we can see how anointing is transformed into a vessel through which God mediates the grace of His salvation to us. **The foundations of**




Confirmation can be found in Luke's account of Jesus' baptism by John in the River Jordan. After "the Holy Spirit descended upon Him in bodily form like a dove" (Luke 3: 22), Jesus then says, "the Spirit of the Lord is Upon me, because He has anointed me to bring glad tidings to the poor" (Luke 4: 18). Jesus' baptism is typically considered the beginning of His public ministry. This is because it was at this point that Jesus, like his ancestors in the line of David, received his anointing.

Jesus, however, was anointed with the Holy Spirit and thereby given the mission of bringing salvation to the human race.

How Confirmation applies to us can be seen through Luke's Gospel and Luke's sequel, the Acts of the Apostles. Consider, in Luke's gospel John the Baptist says, "I am baptizing you with water, but one

mightier than I is coming...He will baptize you with the Holy Spirit and fire." In Acts, the Church, the body of Christ, was anointed with the Holy Spirit during Pentecost in tongues of fire (Acts 2: 3). The Church began its ministry just as Jesus began his, with the anointing of the Holy Spirit. Similarly, when we are Confirmed, we "share more completely in the mission of Jesus Christ and the fullness of the Holy Spirit with which he is filled" (CCC, 1294). That is, when we are anointed with oil and "sealed with the gift of the Holy Spirit", we are commissioned to proclaim in His name "repentance, for the forgiveness of sins...to all the nations" (Luke 24: 47).






