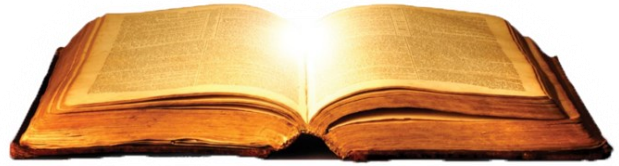
## Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

### *Feast of Christ the King*

We live in a kingdom where we are called to be dreamers – to imagine what it would be if like if the physical world that we live in here on earth were indeed the Kingdom of God! Give the daily events of our lives, a world without sin would truly be an amazing place to be in. Imagine the evening news in our news channels, without a murder to talk about, a theft to report on, a lie from a politician to relate, no stories about children abandoned or abused, imagine a world where there are no abortions, no one starving, no one is homeless, and most of all, no person is unloved. This is what the Kingdom of God ought to look like. We can never make the kingdom of God a reality in the world unless, first it is a reality in our own lives.

When Jesus stood before Pilate, he was asked, Are you the king of the Jews? Christ did not deny that he was indeed a king. But he said, "My kingdom does not belong to this world". Jesus' reply implies he was not the kind of king Pilate imagined: a military or a political ruler but a spiritual one. What is the style and substance of Jesus' kingdom? Jesus is king; a servant who serves, a shepherd who dies for his sheep. The worldly king demanded that they be defended and protected even at the cost of their servants' and soldiers' lives. In contrast, Jesus lays down his life to protect the lives of his sheep. On the cross, Jesus reveals Himself as a King who distributes His gift of most generosity: the gift of pardon to those who crucified Him; the gift of heaven to a repentant thief; the gift of His mother's love to the whole mankind. His teachings spell out a kingdom of justice, love, mercy, peace, and forgiveness.

Dear Parents, Friends, and Families of Corpus Christi,

I spent some time recently thinking about what it means to be the principal of Corpus Christi. What is my mission for our school? I quickly began to realize that my position is not only to run the school academically but also to guide the students and families to a stronger relationship with Jesus Christ. This, I believe, is more important than any job I could ever have, so I have been reflecting, praying, and truly looking at my life.

I know, at times, that we can focus on the negatives, the problems, the conflicts in our lives. These moments sometimes drive us into dark places and maybe even put us into a hole that we feel we cannot dig ourselves out of. To be completely honest with you, I have found myself in those holes several times in my life. There were times when I questioned my faith. The first time I can remember is when I lost my dad at the age of sixteen. I was lost. I was sad. And most of all, I was angry. I was angry at God. How could He do this to my family? Why would He take a man loved by so many at the age of 45? Why would God leave me, a young teenage girl, to face the world without a dad to depend on? My faith was tested, and I took on a life of bitterness, anger, and self-pity.

It wasn't easy to come to terms with that loss and some days I am still not sure that I have. What I do know to be true is that my faith is what ended up helping me through that difficult time. I can remember going to a retreat when I was nineteen years old. I was asked by my former principal, Doc Viglietta, to speak to students about dealing with the loss of my dad because he thought it might be helpful to some of them. Little did Doc know; he was helping me more than anyone else. In those quiet moments, during that retreat – I created a new and stronger relationship with Jesus. During that week, I truly learned what it meant to pray and to communicate with God. I realized that everyone is faced with mountains to climb, and we cannot do it on our own – we need our families, our friends, and most importantly God to help us reach the top.

I want you to know that there are days and times since then that I have struggled through tough times and my faith has been tested. Today, many people are dealing with the present crisis of COVID which has led to feeling alone, unemployment, relationship struggles, death of loved ones, and fear. In this situation, our faith is easily tried, and we often turn away from God. This not only affects us, as adults, but also our children. They look to us for guidance, for hope, for reassurance and most importantly they look to us as a role model in their lives. I know that my relationship with God is one that I must consistently work on, but it brings me peace and my faith helps to give positive witness to me and my family in a difficult situation.

Today, as I write this, I hope you find a moment to really pray. No, I don't mean saying the Our Father or Hail Mary, but really, truly pray and speak to God. I know, without a doubt, that He is there to listen to us. I know, without a doubt, that He is there to guide us through the dark days and lead us into a positive and brighter future. Our faith can truly help us move mountains and help us grow into people that make our world a better place for us, our children, and our grandchildren.
