

Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

28th Sunday in Ordinary Time


Today's readings remind us that we do not possess anything in our life that we refuse to surrender to the Lord. But, in reality our "possessions" often possess us, and we become their prisoners. What we really do is give our "things" top priority in our lives. Thus, we violate the First Great Commandment, which demands that we give absolute and unconditional priority to God. The Gospel tells us of the encounter of the rich young man who comes to Jesus saying: "What should I do to be happy?". Jesus gives the young man the expected answer of his times. "Keep the commandments and you will be happy". He had kept all the laws, and yet he was not happy. Maybe we have sometimes experienced the same in our lives, we have been law-abiding citizens, but there seems to be something missing in our lives. The Gospel tells us that Jesus looked at the man with love. he appreciated what he had been doing, then he confronted him with what was really missing in his life. "There is one thing you lack. Go sell all you have and come follow me." To be really happy he invites the young man to forget the minimum - keeping the law, and go for the maximum- go for it! To merely keep the law is a negative approach to life. What have we done positively with our lives? This is the challenge and the invitation of Jesus to the young man, this is the challenge and the invitation to you and me. To live in love! To go beyond the demands of the law to the demands of love!




