

Father Paul's Reflections on the Readings

30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Today's first reading God says to the remnant of Israel that he will bring them back, comfort them and lead them to the streams of water. He will be a Father to them and take care of them. The Gospel talks of Jesus meeting the blind man,

Bartimaeus, sitting by the roadside begging, who cries out "Son of David, Jesus, have pity on me". What does this tell us? <u>To look up to God</u>. It reminds us that we have to raise our voice and call out to Jesus in faith and confidence. The Blind man had called out to Jesus, now Jesus calls out to him. The moment Bartimaeus hears that Jesus is calling him, he throws off his cloak and goes to Jesus. When he hears the call of Jesus he does not cling on to what he has, whatever may be an obstacle in his going to Jesus, nothing is more important than

meeting Jesus. That is to say look into ourselves. We too want to meet Jesus, we too call out to Jesus, but sometimes when He calls out to us we want to hold on to what we have, our cloak, our ways. Each one of us suffers from spiritual blindness. Hence, we need the light of the Holy Spirit to enlighten us, granting us proper spiritual vision. Then Jesus asks: "What do you want me to do for you?" Jesus wants us to know what we truly desire, hence the question to the blind man. Seeing becomes following; He followed Jesus on the road. Now we notice that a man who can see, has vision, who knows very clearly where he is going and where he should be going. His new sight helps him to follow Jesus and look after others. After he had seen, he did not go home anymore but he followed Jesus.




